The endless string of people going to the bathroom has become a huge distraction, especially at St. Michaels where the bathroom is in the front of the Church. Obviously, emergencies happen, however, visits to the bathroom during Holy Mass should be rare. If needed, please use the bathroom before Mass. In particular I would ask that everyone refrain from making trips to the bathroom during the liturgy of the Eucharist (after the bells have been rung and everyone is kneeling), this is the holiest part of the Mass and everyone's effort at reverence is appreciated.

CATECHESIS ON HOLY MASS

When we enter and leave Church, we genuflect toward the Tabernacle. Christ is present there for our sake. By allowing our right knee to touch the floor, we acknowledge that He is our Lord and God. If we are unable to genuflect, then a bow is sufficient. During Mass, if we pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, we bow reverently. If we come in late to Mass, for whatever reason, we genuflect as usual when entering the pew and then, when we reach our place, we kneel for a few moments in prayer before sitting down. Such little acts of respect may seem insignificant, but they continually remind us that we are not just in any building, but rather in God's own house, which we have the great privilege of visiting. Jesus Christ is always with us, in the tabernacle of every Catholic church. Thank you, Lord, for your presence among us!

Esses pequenos atos de respeito podem parecer insignificantes, mas lembram-nos continuamente que não estamos num edifício qualquer, mas sim na própria casa de Deus, que temos o grande privilégio de visitar. Jesus Cristo está sempre conosco, no sacrário de cada igreja católica. Obrigado, Senhor, pela tua presença entre nós!
