PRAYER OF ST. MICHAEL

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

From Fr. Jay - Why we should attend Stations of the Cross

Each Friday, our parish offers the great Lenten devotion called the Stations of the Cross in which we reflect upon the events of Good Friday, namely the suffering, the passion and the death of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We pray the Stations on Friday for the same reason that we don't eat meat on Fridays – it is the day our Lord made the ultimate sacrifice of laying down his life for us. Each Friday, whether during Lent or not, should be a day in which we remember our Lord's sacrifice.

Lent is known, however, as being a special time for prayer and devotion, which is why we offer the Stations of the Cross each Friday. I personally think that it is so important that it is worth offering it at three different times throughout the day to make it accessible to as many as possible. I want to strongly encourage all parishioners to make an effort to attend the Stations at least once during the Lenten Season. It is more than just remembering what our Lord endured, it is also about coming to a deeper awareness of what His love really means and the profound inner peace that is offered to each of us.

So what are the Stations? What are we actually praying? The Stations are a series of 14 pictures or carvings portraying events in the Passion of Christ, from his condemnation by Pontius Pilate to his being buried. The order of stations is as follows: (1) Jesus is condemned to death, (2) Jesus takes up his cross, (3) Jesus falls the first time, (4) Jesus meets his mother, (5) Simon of Cyrene is made to carry the cross, (6) Veronica wipes Jesus' face, (7) Jesus falls the second time, (8) the women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus, (9) Jesus falls the third time, (10) Jesus is stripped of his garments, (11) Jesus is nailed to the cross, (12) Jesus dies on the cross, (13) Jesus is taken down from the cross, and (14) Jesus is placed in the Holy Sepulcher.

The devotional exercise of visiting and praying in front of each of the 14 stations and meditating on the Passion of Christ stems from the practice of early Christian pilgrims who visited the scenes of the events in Jerusalem and walked the traditional route from the presumed location of Pilate's house to Calvary. One tradition holds that Mary, the mother of Jesus, set up stone markers at her home outside Jerusalem to prayerfully retrace the steps of her son's Passion. St Francis of Assisi popularized the devotion and promoted a great love for the sufferings of Christ.

The Stations have been an important part of my own Lenten devotion and I hope that you will embrace the great blessing and graces that come from attending the Stations on the Fridays of Lent.

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT LENTEN STUDY GROUP

De Pd. Jay - Por que devemos participar na Via Sacra

Todas as sextas-feiras, nossa paróquia oferece a grande devoção quaresmal chamada Via Sacra, na qual refletimos sobre os eventos da Sexta-feira Santa, ou seja, o sofrimento, a paixão e a morte de nosso Senhor e Salvador Jesus Cristo. Rezamos as Estações na sextafeira pela mesma razão que não comemos carne às sextas-feiras – é o dia em que nosso Senhor fez o sacrifício final de dar sua vida por nós. Cada sexta-feira, seja durante a Quaresma ou não, deve ser um dia em que nos lembremos do sacrifício de nosso Senhor.

A Quaresma é conhecida, no entanto, como um tempo especial de oração e devoção, razão pela qual oferecemos a Via Sacra todas as sextas-feiras. Pessoalmente, acho que é tão importante que vale a pena oferecê-lo em três momentos diferentes ao longo do dia para torná-lo acessível ao maior número possível. Desejo encorajar fortemente todos os paroquianos a fazerem um esforço para frequentar as Estações pelo menos uma vez durante o tempo quaresmal. É mais do que apenas lembrar o que nosso Senhor suportou, é também chegar a uma consciência mais profunda do que Seu amor realmente significa e da profunda paz interior que é oferecida a cada um de nós.

Então, quais são as estações? O que estamos realmente orando? As Estações são uma série de 14 fotos ou esculturas que retratam eventos da Paixão de Cristo, desde sua condenação por Pontius Pilatos até seu sepultamento. A ordem das estações é a seguinte: (1) Jesus é condenado à morte, (2) Jesus toma sua cruz, (3) Jesus cai pela primeira vez, (4) Jesus encontra sua mãe, (5) Simão de Cirene é feito para carregar a cruz, (6) Verônica enxuga o rosto de Jesus, (7) Jesus cai pela segunda vez, (8) as mulheres de Jerusalém choram por Jesus, (9) Jesus cai pela terceira vez, (10) Jesus é despido de suas vestes, (11) Jesus é pregado na cruz, (12) Jesus morre na cruz, (13) Jesus é retirado da cruz e (14) Jesus é colocado no Santo Sepulcro.

O exercício devocional de visitar e rezar em frente a cada uma das 14 estações e meditar a Paixão de Cristo decorre da prática dos primeiros peregrinos cristãos que visitavam os cenários dos acontecimentos em Jerusalém e percorriam o caminho tradicional desde o suposto local da casa ao Calvário. Uma tradição afirma que Maria, a mãe de Jesus, colocou marcadores de pedra em sua casa fora de Jerusalém para refazer em oração os passos da Paixão de seu filho. São Francisco de Assis popularizou a devoção e promoveu um grande amor pelos sofrimentos de Cristo.
