### From Fr. Jay - Lent and Almsgiving

I want to thank everyone for the generous response to the appeal for those in the Ukraine, especially my classmate Fr. Volodymer. Through your generosity, we were able to send over \$3500 to those suffering in that region. In addition to our financial support, let us also remain diligent in our daily prayers for peace.

This opportunity to help those in need is very practical way to put into action the Lenten mandate of "almsgiving." It isn't a word that we use very often, but "almsgiving" is certainly very much a part of who we are and who we are called to be, namely, generous people who act charitably to those who are less fortunate.

Usually when people hear the word, "Almsgiving" they naturally think of Lent, and perhaps associate it with meatless Fridays, fish fry's, rice bowls and other Lenten practices. But acts of charity are clearly meant to be ingrained into the fabric of who we are as Christians throughout the entire year. It is an integral part of our spiritual lives and not just the social work of the church. It is something that, if done with the right intentions, can lead us into a deeper relationship with our Lord. Let us remember what our Lord said to us on Ash Wednesday about Almsgiving - "do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing." In other words, let us not publicize or draw attention to our generosity or do it so that others will know about.

It is an outward sign of love for one another, which originates in some act of sacrifice of our own goods or time. But it isn't just about helping others, there are also spiritual benefits for ourselves. In the act of making a sacrifice to give to another, we are saying, I will go without something I want or need to help someone less fortunate, and in doing so, we become more like our Lord.

The Church defines almsgiving as a witness to fraternal charity and a work of justice pleasing to God (Catechism, 2462). Practically speaking, it is the act of donating money or food or clothing to the poor. The Latin origin of the word is rooted in the meaning of "mercy" – hence these acts of generosity are corporal works of mercy.

Let us find creative ways to make sacrifices and to use what we are giving up to not only benefit those who are in need, but also draw us closer to our Lord, whose example we are trying to imitate.

# St. Joseph Church Fall River, Massachusetts

March 2, 2022 Ash Wednesday

Dear St Joseph's Parishioner,

This past summer, I announced the planning for our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a parish which will be celebrated in 2023. I explained the need to begin a capital campaign to raise \$250K to make necessary repairs to the exterior of both the church and parish office buildings, the completion of our organ restoration, a new tabernacle and the financial stability of our parish.

Today, I write to you again to provide you an update on the first six months of this two-year campaign and the progress that has been made thus far. I want to begin by thanking each family that has made a donation or pledge to this important restoration project. With the rising costs of housing, groceries and gasoline, I know that for many it is a sacrifice to make such generous donations, and I want to say thank you for such incredible kindness. As of today, the campaign has raised \$86,830 which puts us slightly ahead of schedule.

I hope you would all agree that the work done to the exterior of the church, the trim around the roof and windows, the doors and the parish office look beautiful. While the painting came in under budget, the necessary carpentry repairs were much more extensive and more costly. We budgeted S150K for the project, but the actual cost was \$181,568. I am currently getting closer to securing a new Tabernacle for the Blessed Sacrament and the 3<sup>rd</sup> stage of the organ restoration is currently underway. This stage should hopefully be completed before Easter.

An important part of the campaign was folding our annual appeal for this past year and next year into the campaign, so that I was not asking for financial assistance twice. The annual appeal is an integral part of our annual budget, especially this year as the cost of oil has hit us hard which was compounded by a number of weekend snow storms and lower than normal Mass attendance.

As we enter into the second quarter of this important campaign, I want to humbly appeal to all parishioners to support this campaign. There are red Capital Campaign envelopes in your monthly envelope packet and also in the back of the church. As always, please know of my daily prayers for each of you, for your good health, for your families and that each day you may grow closer to the Lord.

#### Do Pe. Jay - Quaresma e Esmola

Quero agradecer a todos pela generosa resposta ao apelo dos que estão na Ucrânia, especialmente ao meu colega Pe. Volodímero. Através de sua generosidade, conseguimos enviar mais de \$3,500 para aqueles que sofrem naquela região. Além de nosso apoio financeiro, também permaneçamos diligentes em nossas orações diárias pela paz.

Esta oportunidade de ajudar os necessitados é uma maneira muito prática de colocar em ação o mandato quaresmal de "esmola". Não é uma palavra que usamos com muita frequência, mas "esmola" certamente faz parte de quem somos e de quem somos chamados a ser, ou seja, pessoas generosas que agem caridosamente com aqueles que são menos afortunados.

Normalmente, quando as pessoas ouvem a palavra "Esmola", elas naturalmente pensam na Quaresma e talvez a associam a sextas-feiras sem carne, peixes fritos, tigelas de arroz e outras práticas da Quaresma. Mas os atos de caridade são claramente destinados a serem enraizados no tecido de quem somos como cristãos durante todo o ano. É uma parte integral de nossa vida espiritual e não apenas o trabalho social da igreja. É algo que, se feito com as intenções corretas, pode nos levar a um relacionamento mais profundo com nosso Senhor. Lembremo-nos do que nosso Senhor nos disse na quarta-feira de cinzas sobre a esmola: "não deixe sua mão esquerda saber o que sua mão direita está fazendo". Em outras palavras, não divulguemos ou chamemos a atenção para nossa generosidade ou o façamos para que outros saibam.

É um sinal externo de amor mútuo, que se origina em algum ato de sacrifício de nossos próprios bens ou tempo. Mas não se trata apenas de ajudar os outros, também há benefícios espirituais para nós mesmos. No ato de fazer um sacrifício para dar a outro, estamos dizendo: ficarei sem algo que quero ou preciso para ajudar alguém menos afortunado e, ao fazê-lo, nos tornamos mais semelhantes ao nosso Senhor.

A Igreja define a esmola como um testemunho de caridade fraterna e uma obra de justiça agradável a Deus (Catecismo, 2462). Praticamente falando, é o ato de doar dinheiro ou alimentos ou roupas para os pobres. A origem latina da palavra está enraizada no significado de "misericórdia" – portanto, esses atos de generosidade são obras de misericórdia corporais.

Encontremos maneiras criativas de fazer sacrifícios e usar o que estamos abrindo mão para não apenas beneficiar os necessitados, mas também nos aproximar de nosso Senhor, cujo exemplo estamos tentando imitar.


