EASTER VIGIL

Due to an unexpected circumstance out of my control, we do not have a priest to help me on Holy Saturday to celebrate the Vigil Mass. Unlike Holy Thursday and Good Friday where we have flexibility with the times we can offer the Masses, the Vigil on Holy Saturday can not be celebrated before 7pm. Therefore, I am forced to offer only Vigil, which I know is hard to hear. The only fair way to do this is to alternate each year between both parishes. We will begin this year with Mass at St. Michael's. Next year the Vigil will be at St. Joseph's and we will alternate each year going forward. This is an opportunity for us to prayer for vocations and encourage young men to consider the priesthood. It is becoming more and more difficult to find priests to help cover Masses and I am only 1 person and so I ask for your patience and understanding. I promise to make the Holy Week liturgies beautiful and hope to see all of you there.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

From Fr. Jay - Getting Ready for Holy Week

Beginning with the celebration of Palm Sunday next weekend, we enter into what is called "Holy Week" which as the name indicates, is the most important time of year for us as Catholics, especially Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday. As I have said in the past, it would be a great shame if I did not see you between Palm Sunday and Easter – I want to appeal to you to make every effort to be present at the beautiful liturgies that the Church offers us to enter into the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord. These celebrations are not merely remembering historical events, but entering into the deepest mysteries of our faith.

On Palm Sunday, we recall Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We recall how at one moment crowds are acclaiming Jesus as Lord and singing "Hosanna in the highest" while waving palms branches. The next moment, they are screaming, "Crucify Him." The blessed palms that we receive at this Mass can serve as a reminder that while we can say that Jesus is Lord, it is our sinfulness that brought him to the cross.

On Holy Thursday, we remember the Last Supper and the great gift that Jesus gave us in the Eucharist. This Mass, and the Eucharistic Adoration afterwards, is intended to enkindle in each of us a deeper love and devotion for the True Presence of our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I believe the greatest way to do this is through sincere reverence in how we approach the altar and receive the Eucharist. We must all work together to restore a sense of the sacred.

On Good Friday, we remember that our Lord sacrificed his life for our salvation. Jesus was brutally nailed to a cross and hung upon it to suffer and be humiliated because of our sins. This day should be marked with a solemn awareness of what our Lord did for us. If we are able, we should take the day off from work and refrain from secular activities. There will be many opportunities to come to the Church that day to stay focused.

I will explain more about Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday next week, but here I want to simply encourage everyone to make effort to prepare for Holy Week by making time to attend the services, Masses and other opportunities to come together to pray as a community. This is our week as Catholics and let us embrace it and put in lots of effort, the Lord will bless us for it.

Do Pe. Jay - Preparando-se para a Semana Santa

Começando com a celebração do Domingo de Ramos no próximo fim de semana, entramos na chamada “Semana Santa” que, como o nome indica, é a época mais importante do ano para nós como católicos, especialmente a Quinta-feira Santa até o Domingo de Páscoa. Como eu disse no passado, seria uma grande pena se eu não o visse entre o Domingo de Ramos e a Páscoa – quero apelar a você para fazer todo o esforço para estar presente nas belas liturgias que a Igreja nos oferece para entrar na Paixão, Morte e Ressurreição de Nosso Senhor. Estas celebrações não são meramente recordar acontecimentos históricos, mas entrar nos mistérios mais profundos da nossa fé.

No Domingo de Ramos, recordamos a entrada triunfal de Cristo em Jerusalém. Lembramos como em um momento as multidões estão aclamando Jesus como Senhor e cantando “Hosana nas alturas” enquanto agitam ramos de palmeiras. No momento seguinte, eles estão gritando: “Crucifica-o”. As palmas abençoadas que recebemos nesta Missa podem servir como um lembrete de que, embora possamos dizer que Jesus é o Senhor, foi nossa pecaminosidade que o trouxe à cruz.

Na Quinta-feira Santa, recordamos a Última Ceia e o grande presente que Jesus nos deu na Eucaristia. Esta Missa, e depois a Adoração Eucarística, pretende acender em cada um de nós um amor e uma devoção mais profundos pela Verdadeira Presença de Nosso Senhor no Santíssimo Sacramento. Acredito que a melhor maneira de fazer isso é através da reverência sincera em como nos aproximamos do altar e recebemos a Eucaristia. Devemos todos trabalhar juntos para restaurar o sentido do sagrado.

Na Sexta-feira Santa, lembramos que nosso Senhor sacrificou sua vida por nossa salvação. Jesus foi brutalmente pregado numa cruz e pendurado nela para sofrer e ser humilhado por causa dos nossos pecados. Este dia deve ser marcado com uma consciência solene do que nosso Senhor fez por nós. Se pudermos, devemos tirar o dia de folga do trabalho e abster-nos de atividades seculares. Haverá muitas oportunidades de vir à Igreja naquele dia para manter o foco.

Vou explicar mais sobre o Sábado Santo e o Domingo de Páscoa na próxima semana, mas aqui quero simplesmente encorajar todos a se esforçarem para se preparar para a Semana Santa, reservando tempo para assistir aos cultos, missas e outras oportunidades de se reunir para rezar em comunidade. Esta é a nossa semana como católicos e vamos abraçá-la e fazer muito esforço, o Senhor nos abençoará por isso.

VIGILIA PASCAL

Devido a uma circunstância inesperada fora do meu controle, não temos um padre para me ajudar no Sábado Santo a celebrar a Missa da Vigília. O Sábado Santo não pode ser celebrado antes das 7PM. Portanto, sou forçado a oferecer apenas uma Vigília, que sei que é difícil de ouvir. A única maneira justa de fazer isso é alternar a cada ano entre as duas paróquias. Começaremos este ano com a Missa em São Miguel. No próximo ano, a Vigília será em São José e alternaremos a cada ano daqui para frente. Esta é uma oportunidade para orarmos pelas vocações e encorajar os jovens a considerarem o sacerdócio. Está se tornando cada vez mais difícil encontrar padres para ajudar a cobrir as missas e eu sou apenas uma pessoa e por isso peço sua paciência e compreensão. Prometo tornar belas as liturgias da Semana Santa e espero ver todos lá.
