THE HOLY SEASON OF ADVENT

The Season of Advent begins next weekend! It is a blessed and holy time of year in which we make many preparations for the celebration of our Lord's birth! With society becoming more and more secular, we as Catholics must make a concerted effort to make Advent and Christmas a truly spiritual and faithful celebration. I invite each of you as individuals and families to think about and choose a way in which you will make this season of Advent a spiritual time of preparation, perhaps it is saying the Rosary together as a family each night, or one night a week. Maybe it is going to daily Mass if you schedule allows. Perhaps it is going to confession, if you have not been in a while. Perhaps it is going to Adoration on Tuesday nights or during the day on Wednesday. Maybe it is Bible Study or reading a good Catholic book. Choose something to do this Advent, and I guarantee, Christmas will be that much greater of a celebration!

LITURGICAL CHANGES FOR ADVENT

The Holy Season of Advent is meant to spiritually and liturgically prepare our hearts for Christmas. The liturgy is meant to grab our attention and focus us toward the Lord's coming. Here at our parishes, Mass will be celebrated "Ad Orientem" (with the priest and the congregation all facing the same direction) as we have done the past few years. To offer options to all parishioners, this will only be done at the 9:30AM at St. Michael's and the 10:45AM at St. Joseph's. The music is also notice-ably different during Advent. The Gloria is not said or sung at the beginning of Mass. The "Kyrie" (Lord, have mercy) will be chanted in the original Greek (Kyrie Eleison, Christe Eleison, Kyrie Eleison). The "Holy, Holy, Holy" and the "Lamb of God" will be chanted in Latin. These changes will only be for the for weeks of Advent.

ENTRANCE AND COMMUNION ANTIPHONS

You have probably noticed the use of a "Communion Antiphon" at Mass the last few months in place of a hymn. I want to take this opportunity to explain further what the Antiphon is and why we use them at Mass. The "Entrance Antiphon (Introit), Offertory Prayer, and Communion Antiphons are called the "Propers of the Mass" which match the Gospel or Feast of the day. Proper texts of the Mass change every day. In addition to the Antiphons, the Responsorial Psalm and the prayers said by the priest are also proper texts. Proper texts differ from the "Ordinary" texts of the Mass which never change: Gloria, Kyrie, Sanctus, Agnus Dei, etc. Up until Vatican II the antiphons were sung in Latin by the choir *instead* of an opening, offertory, and communion hymn. The congregation joined in singing the Creed, Gloria, and chanted Mass responses (which they still do). You may remember a few years ago when the revised translation of the English Mass was introduced with a more accurate translation. This process caused many Catholics to rediscover the Proper Antiphons, which were a part of our Mass tradition for hundreds of years. Since Vatican II did not suggest that the Proper Antiphons be removed, many contemporary Catholic composers have been looking for ways to incorporate them back into the Mass. We have been singing the Communion Antiphon for several months now. Beginning with Advent and the new liturgical year, we will be able to hear the Entrance Antiphon before Mass begins as a way of helping us to prepare our hearts and minds. I hope the incorporation these sacred text enhances your worship and is another reminder of the Gospel message for the day. The Antiphons for both the Entrance and Communion can be found in our new hymnals.

A EUCHARISTIC ADVENT

This year, during the four Sundays of Advent, the homily will focus on the Eucharist! Recently, you heard me mention that a recent survey revealed that only about 20% of Catholic believe that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. To focus on rediscovering and strengthening our faith in the Eucharist, each Sunday of Advent will be a teaching on the Eucharist using different images and themes of Christmas. There will also be a brief catechesis here in the bulletin as well.

SACRED SILENCE AND PRAYER BEFORE MASS

Recently, Pope Francis called out the common habit of chatting with people before Mass, stressing that this is a time for silent prayer, when we prepare our hearts for an encounter with the Lord. "When we go to Mass, maybe we arrive five minutes before, and we start to chitchat with those in front of us," the Pope said, "However, it is not a moment for chitchat. It is a moment of silence for preparing ourselves for dialogue, a time for the heart to collect itself in order to prepare for the encounter with Jesus," he said, adding that "silence is so important." I am happy that many have commented on how they enjoy the Gregorian Chant before Holy Mass, helping them to prepare for Holy Mass. Arriving early and recollecting ourselves is an important way to preparation for the celebration of Holy Mass as it helps us to clear our mind, recall why we are there, and also to enter into the sacred presence of God. Because Holy Mass is a communal celebration, there is the temptation to talk with others, but I respectfully ask that we try and keep conversations until after Mass, or if they are necessary, to have them in the foyer area or outside, so as to not disturb others who have come to pray. Let us always remember that we are in a sacred space and should conduct ourselves accordingly.

ADVENT CONFESSIONS

In addition to our regularly scheduled confessions times, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered at St. Joseph's on <u>December 11th</u> from 6:30-7:30PM. What better way to prepare for Christmas than by examining our consciences and going to confession to receive our Lord's mercy and forgiveness. There will be multiple priests here to hear confessions.
