From Fr. Jay-Preparing for our Lord's Resurrection

More than Christmas even, Easter is the most important and holiest day of the year for Christians for this is the day that we celebrate our Lord's Resurrection from the dead. It is the culmination of God's plan of salvation in which He sent Jesus into the world to suffer and die for our sins, but to conquer sin and death by rising from the dead.

Easter is a time in which we recall the overwhelming sense of joy that our Blessed Mother Mary and the Disciples experience when they saw Jesus 3 days after He was crucified and buried. We are reminded that death does not have the final word, because in Christ's rising, we have the hope of eternal life and being with the Lord forever in heaven.

Holy Saturday night is the most sacred liturgy in the Church, as we begin in darkness, holding vigil for the Lord's resurrection. We bless and light the Easter candle, which is used for baptisms and funerals, and each person holds a vigil candle as the exultet is chanted. We listen to stories from the Old Testament that highlight salvation history, from creation to the great flood, the stories of Moses, Abraham and the Prophets until the Gloria is once again sung and the church rejoices as we celebrate Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, who by his rising has dispelled the darkness caused by sin.

This is also a Mass in which we welcome adults into the Catholic Church, people who were not baptized as infants or who didn't receive their First Communion or Confirmation. It is a great reminder to us that we should always be welcoming others into our community and always provide a sense of welcome to anyone who is visiting or new to our parish.

Easter is a time in which families will gather with each other, but let us remember that we first and foremost gather with our parish family around the Altar of the Lord, from which we are truly fed, by Jesus Christ himself, who is the Paschal Lamb, who gave us His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, who shed His Blood on the Cross and whose Body was raised on Easter Sunday.

This is the Holiest Week of the year! It is filled with great traditions and beautiful liturgies. I can't encourage you more strongly to make the effort to join us for each of the Holy Week liturgies. Let us enter into Holy Week with great faith and enter into these Sacred Mysteries and be drawn closer to our Lord. HOLY WEEK

This weekend we celebrate Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week, the holiest and most important time of year for us as Catholics. It is a time in which we remember the sacred events of our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection – the very heart of our Christian Faith. I want to encourage you and your family to attend all of the events of Holy Week as a way of entering into the mysteries of our faith and also of passing on the traditions of our Church onto our children. All parishioners should make it a real priority to attend each of the Holy Week Masses.

ROMEIROS

The "Romeiros," a group of several hundred people will be walking to each church in the city, continuing the great Azorean tradition. They will be praying at St. Michaels at 10am and at St. Joseph's at 11am. I invite you to gather on the steps of each Church to welcome them and observe this very moving tradition.

EASTER VIGIL

Due to an unexpected circumstance out of my control, we do not have a priest to help me on Holy Saturday to celebrate the Vigil Mass. Unlike Holy Thursday and Good Friday where we have flexibility with the times we can offer the Masses, the Vigil on Holy Saturday can not be celebrated before 7pm. Therefore, I am forced to offer only Vigil, which I know is hard to hear. The only fair way to do this is to alternate each year between both parishes. We will begin this year with Mass at St. Michael's. Next year the Vigil will be at St. Joseph's and we will alternate each year going forward. This is an opportunity for us to prayer for vocations and encourage young men to consider the priesthood. It is becoming more and more difficult to find priests to help cover Masses and I am only 1 person and so I ask for your patience and understanding. I promise to make the Holy Week liturgies beautiful and hope to see all of you there.



Preparando-se para a Ressurreição de N. Senhor

Mais do que o Natal, a Páscoa é o dia mais importante e sagrado do ano para os cristãos, pois é o dia em que celebramos a Ressurreição de nosso Senhor dentre os mortos. É a culminação do plano de salvação de Deus no qual Ele enviou Jesus para o mundo para sofrer e morrer por nossos pecados, mas para vencer o pecado e a morte ressuscitando dos mortos.

A Páscoa é um tempo em que recordamos a imensa sensação de alegria que nossa santa Mãe Maria e os Discípulos experimentaram quando viram Jesus 3 dias depois que Ele foi crucificado e sepultado. Somos lembrados de que a morte não tem a palavra final, porque na ressurreição de Cristo, temos a esperança da vida eterna e estar com o Senhor para sempre no céu.

A noite do Sábado Santo é a liturgia mais sagrada da Igreja, pois começamos nas trevas, em vigília pela ressurreição do Senhor. Abençoamos e acendemos a vela pascal, que é usada para batismos e funerais, e cada pessoa segura uma vela de vigília enquanto se canta o exultante. Ouvimos histórias do Antigo Testamento que destacam a história da salvação, desde a criação até o grande dilúvio, as histórias de Moisés, Abraão e os Profetas até que o Glória seja novamente cantada e a igreja se celebre Jesus Cristo, a Luz do Mundo, que por sua ascensão dissipou as trevas causadas pelo pecado.

Esta é também uma Missa em que acolhemos na Igreja Católica os adultos, as pessoas que não foram baptizadas na infância ou que não receberam a Primeira Comunhão ou a Confirmação. É um grande lembrete para nós que devemos sempre acolher outras pessoas em nossa comunidade e sempre proporcionar uma sensação de boas-vindas a quem está visitando ou é novo nas nossas paróquias.

A Páscoa é um tempo em que as famílias se reúnem, mas lembremo-nos de que, antes de mais nada, nos reunimos com a nossa família paroquial em torno do Altar do Senhor, do qual somos verdadeiramente alimentados, pelo próprio Jesus Cristo, que é o Pascal Cordeiro, que nos deu o Seu Corpo e Sangue na Eucaristia, que derramou o Seu Sangue na Cruz e cujo Corpo ressuscitou no Domingo de Páscoa.

Esta é a Semana mais Santa do ano! Está cheio de grandes tradições e belas liturgias. Não posso encorajá-lo mais fortemente a fazer um esforço para se juntar a nós em cada uma das liturgias da Semana Santa. Entremos na Semana Santa com muita fé e entremos nestes Sagrados Mistérios e nos aproximemos de Nosso Senhor.

VIGILIA PASCAL

Devido a uma circunstância inesperada fora do meu controle, não temos um padre para me ajudar no Sábado Santo a celebrar a Missa da Vigília. O Sábado Santo não pode ser celebrado antes das 7PM. Portanto, sou forçado a oferecer apenas uma Vigília, que sei que é difícil de ouvir. A única maneira justa de fazer isso é alternar a cada ano entre as duas paróquias. Começaremos este ano com a Missa em São Miguel. No próximo ano, a Vigília será em São José e alternaremos a cada ano daqui para frente. Esta é uma oportunidade para orarmos pelas vocações e encorajar os jovens a considerarem o sacerdócio. Está se tornando cada vez mais difícil encontrar padres para ajudar a cobrir as missas e eu sou apenas uma pessoa e por isso peço sua paciência e compreensão. Prometo tornar belas as liturgias da Semana Santa e espero ver todos lá.
