From Fr. Jay – Ash Wednesday

This coming Wednesday, Catholics will flock to their parish Churches for the reception of ashes and the beginning of the Lenten season. We will mark out foreheads with ashes in the shape of a cross as we hear the words, "*Remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return*" or "*Repent and be faithful to the Gospel*." I think it is worth a brief reflection upon each of these powerful statements as we embrace the penitential season of Lent.

Before we look at either of those statements, however, let us ponder for a moment the whole of idea of doing penance and such a profound gesture of marking our foreheads with ashes. What is penance? It is an act of self-denial or mortification, it is denying ourselves something good to remind ourselves that we are made for more than the luxuries and comforts of this world, we were made for greatness, we were made for heaven, we were made for the Lord and that is what will truly make us happy. The acts of penance that we willing embrace remind us that we are sinners and that we are in need of real change if we are to get to heaven and be with the Lord.

This brings us to the Ash Wednesday public act of penance of putting ashes on our forehead so as to communicate, "I am a sinner." But the ashes are placed on our head in the shape of a cross, to remind us that although we are sinners, we have a savior, Jesus Christ who died for our sins. Hearing the words, "remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return" is a very vivid reminder that we are mortal and that we should never lose sight of our death and the moment we will stand before our Lord for judgment. The other statement, "repent and be faithful to the Gospel" is the advice on how we are to prepare for judgement day, by acknowledging our sinfulness and changing the direction of our lives.

In addition to marking ourselves with ashes, Ash Wednesday is also a day of fasting and abstinence in which we refrain from eating, as another expression of self-denial and also as a way of creating a spiritual hunger. We remember our Lord's example, where he spent 40 days in the desert fasting and praying. The guidelines for fasting are in the bulletin. Let us fully embrace the penance and sacrifice and fasting of this holy season.

During Lent, Deacon Paul will be leading a study on the Seven Last Words of Christ- the seven short sentences uttered by Jesus as he endured his crucifixion. This will help us bring the real meaning of Easter alive! Sessions will be held on Mondays during Lent from 10:00 am-11:30 am at St. Josephs Hall. If there is enough interest, it will also be offered Monday evenings from 6:30 pm-8:00 pm. The cost will be \$5 for a workbook. SANCTUARY LAMPS



DIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

All adults 18 and older are bound to the law of fast up to their 60th year, limited to a single full meal that is meatless. Two other meatless meals may be taken to maintain one's needs, but together they shall not equal a full meal. The two prescribed days of Fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are 14 years of age and older are obliged to serve the Law of Abstinence from meat on all Fridays of Lent, as well as of course Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. During Lent, we the Christian faithful are bound to do penance in virtue of the divine law; in order that all may be joined in a common observance of penance, penitential days are prescribed in while in all in a special way pray, exercise works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their responsibilities more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence.

Do Padre Jay – Quarta-Feira de Cinzas

Na próxima quarta-feira, os católicos se reunirão em suas igrejas paroquiais para a recepção das cinzas e o início do tempo quaresmal. Marcaremos as testas com cinzas em forma de cruz ao ouvirmos as palavras: "Lembre-se de que você é pó e ao pó você voltará" ou "Arrependa-se e seja fiel ao Evangelho". Acho que vale a pena uma breve reflexão sobre cada uma dessas declarações poderosas ao abraçarmos o tempo penitencial da Quaresma.

Antes de olharmos para qualquer uma dessas declarações, no entanto, vamos refletir por um momento sobre toda a idéia de fazer penitência e um gesto tão profundo de marcar nossas testas com cinzas. O que é penitência? É um ato de abnegação ou mortificação, é negar a nós mesmos algo de bom para nos lembrarmos que fomos feitos para mais do que os luxos e confortos deste mundo, fomos feitos para a grandeza, fomos feitos para o céu, fomos feitos para o Senhor e é isso que nos fará verdadeiramente felizes. Os atos de penitência que desejamos abraçar nos lembram que somos pecadores e que precisamos de uma mudança real se quisermos chegar ao céu e estar com o Senhor.

Isso nos leva ao ato público de penitência da Quartafeira de Cinzas de colocar cinzas em nossa testa para comunicar: "Sou um pecador". Mas as cinzas são colocadas em nossa cabeça em forma de cruz, para nos lembrar que, embora sejamos pecadores, temos um salvador, Jesus Cristo, que morreu por nossos pecados. Ouvir as palavras "lembra-te de que és pó e ao pó voltarás" é um lembrete muito vívido de que somos mortais e que nunca devemos perder de vista nossa morte e o momento em que compareceremos diante de nosso Senhor para julgamento. A outra declaração, "arrependam-se e sejam fiéis ao Evangelho" é o conselho sobre como devemos nos preparar para o dia do julgamento, reconhecendo nossa pecaminosidade e mudando a direção de nossas vidas.

Além de nos marcarmos com cinzas, a Quarta-feira de Cinzas também é um dia de jejum e abstinência em que nos abstemos de comer, como outra expressão de abnegação e também como forma de criar uma fome espiritual. Lembramos o exemplo de nosso Senhor, onde ele passou 40 dias no deserto jejuando e orando. As orientações para o jejum estão no boletim. Abracemos plenamente a penitência, o sacrifício e o jejum desta época sagrada.

MATRICULAS PARA A ESCOLA

REGULAMENTOS DA QUARESMA

Todos os adultos com 18 anos ou mais estão sujeitos à lei do jejum até os 60 anos, limitado a uma única refeição completa sem carne. Duas outras refeições sem carne podem ser tomadas para manter as necessidades, mas juntas elas não equivalem a uma refeição completa. Os dois dias prescritos de Jejum são a Quarta-Feira de Cinzas e a Sexta-Feira Santa. Aqueles que têm 14 anos ou mais são obrigados a cumprir a Lei da Abstinência de carne em todas as Sextas-Feiras da Quaresma, bem como na Quarta-Feira de Cinzas e na Sexta-Feira Santa. Durante a Quaresma, nós, fiéis cristãos, somos obrigados a fazer penitência em virtude da lei divina; para que todos se unam na observância comum da penitência, prescrevem-se os dias penitenciais, enquanto em todos, de modo especial, rezam, praticam obras de piedade e caridade e negam-se a si mesmos, cumprindo mais fielmente as suas responsabilidades e, sobretudo, observando o jejum e a abstinência.
